

### Can I put more bags out next to the container?

Only if you have signed up for the Unlimited Service, will you be able to place out a total of 2 cubic yards (this includes the recycling and solid waste containers).

### What items may not be placed inside the waste container?

Construction debris, oil, paints, pesticides, automobile parts, batteries, tires, medical waste, deceased animals and other hazardous items are prohibited. Visit Media County Solid Waste for information regarding the safe disposal of household hazardous waste.

### If I move, should I take my container with me?

No, the container must remain at the address where it was delivered. Containers are the property of Republic Services.

### Where Can I Purchase Bags?

You can call 440.458.3216 to purchase Republic Services bags for your bag service. The cost is \$26.00 and must be prepaid. Please allow 24-48 hours for the bags to be delivered.

### When is My Pickup Day?

Brunswick Hills residents will be serviced on Thursdays and Fridays each week.

# Your service day is:

Beginning in April, all residential customers in Brunswick Hills will begin utilizing new containers provided by Republic Services® for weekly recycling and waste collections. Like thousands of your neighbors in surrounding communities, you will be participating in a program that allows for greater recycling participation and helps make your neighborhood much cleaner on waste collection days. The new containers will be distributed throughout the city beginning the weeks of March 16, 2020 and March 23, 2020.

## Choice of Service

- Unlimited Service: A 65-gallon recycling container and a 96-gallon waste container. All for \$54.87 per quarter, not to exceed 2 cubic yards
- Bag service for a 65-gallon recycling container. No yard waste or bulk. All for \$20.25 per quarter, plus the cost of bags (10 bags for \$26.00).
- All residents will start with the 96-gallon waste containers. You may call after July 1, 2020 to make changes to your service.

## Solid Waste

Residents should begin using their new solid waste containers on the next scheduled collection day after receiving them.

- All waste must be placed in the 95-gallon blue container with the black lid.
- Containers must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day, but no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before.
- Containers must be placed with the arrows pointing toward the street to allow for the collection of your container contents.
- Residents listed as qualifying seniors by the city's water department will receive a 65-gallon waste container

instead of the larger 95-gallon waste container unless otherwise requested by contacting Republic Services.

- Qualified seniors will continue to receive a discounted rate as they did in the past.

## Recycling

- A 65-gallon green container will be provided for all your weekly recycling needs.
- Recycling containers will be emptied on a weekly basis on your regular collection day.
- All items listed below may be placed loosely in the container provided:

## Acceptable Materials:

- Newspapers, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, office paper, soft covered books, file folders, and crushed boxes and clean pizza boxes.
- Cardboard from non-food items such as shipping boxes (please flatten, fold, or cut to fit inside the recycling container).
- Plastic containers (narrow neck only) such as milk, juice, water, detergent and shampoo containers.
- Glass food and beverage containers.
- Aluminum and steel food/beverage containers. Empty and rinse containers and remove caps. Please do not place recyclables in plastic bags.

## Unacceptable Materials:

- No plastic bags or plastic wrap (these can be dropped off at some retail locations).
- No paint, pesticides or household hazardous waste.
- No polystyrene foam, heavily soiled pizza boxes, carbon paper, electronic waste or medications.
- No light bulbs, flower pots, car batteries or scrap metal.
- No yard waste.



The Medina County Solid Waste District provides the opportunity to responsibly dispose of household hazardous waste, electronic waste, medications or other prescription drugs.

## **When will my container arrive, and when can I start using it?**

Containers will be dropped off the weeks of March 16, 2020 and March 23, 2020.

## **How do I use the containers?**

Each container should be placed curbside at least 3 feet away from any other item (mailbox, parked car, low-hanging tree limb, etc.) so it can be lifted by the truck's mechanical arm. The container handle should face your house.

## **Must all waste be placed inside the container?**

The 95-gallon container is designed to meet the needs of most residents. All bagged waste must be placed inside your container with the lid completely closed. Containers cannot be emptied if items are left on top of the lid.

## **Can I put waste and recyclables in one container?**

No, please use the green recycling container with the light blue lid for your recyclables and the blue waste container with the black lid for your solid waste.
